School Improvement Plan

We are working on the following three priorities this year:

- 1. To develop writing by building syntactic control. To form sentences that clearly express an intended meaning. We are teaching children how to build well-structured sentences so they can clearly and accurately communicate their ideas through writing.
- 2. To improve the quality of teaching and learning by embedding Co-operative Learning structures. We are working to make lessons even more engaging and effective by using Co-operative Learning techniques. This means children will regularly work together in small groups, helping each other to learn and solve problems. It encourages teamwork, builds confidence and helps every child take an active role in their learning. As a result, children are more motivated, understand topics more deeply and develop important social skills that will benefit them both in and out of school.
- 3. To ensure a smooth transition between Reception and Year 1 by implementing a continuous provision curriculum in Year 1. We want to make sure that children feel confident and happy as they move from Reception to Year 1. To help with this, we're continuing to use play-based and hands-on learning activities in Year 1, similar to what they're used to in Reception. This approach helps children settle more easily, keeps them engaged in their learning, and supports their development at a pace that's right for them. It also helps build independence, creativity, and a love of learning that will support them throughout their school journey.

We are undertaking training throughout this year in all three areas and will be implementing strategies into our everyday classroom practice. We evaluate impact at the end of each term and build on this accordingly. We are working closely with governors who are actively involved in the school improvement process alongside school leaders. We will keep you updated with the progress of each priority each term.

Anti-bullying Week: Monday 10th-Friday 14th November 2025

We are having an **Odd Socks Day** on Monday 10th to kickstart our 'anti-bullying' week, with adults and children being encouraged to wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique.

Organised by the Anti-Bullying Alliance (ABA), this national campaign is a valuable opportunity for schools to unite and promote kindness, inclusion and respect among pupils. This year's theme, *Power for Good*, encourages pupils to recognise the power they each hold - to speak up, support one another and create positive change when they see bullying, whether online or in person.

We explain to all our children that although there is a national anti-bullying week, at Clover Hill it is obviously an anti-bullying week EVERY week. We always ask the children to think carefully about their behaviour and attitude to others. We invest a lot of time and care in trying to prevent bullying so that children make the correct choices in their behaviours and friendships in the first instance.

Our pupils are supported so that they are aware of what to do if they are having problems with other pupils that could lead to bullying **but also how to evaluate when things just go wrong due to general falling out with friends or accidental upsets**. Falling out with others can be really upsetting and so we work extremely hard to get children to empathise with each other and to unpick misunderstandings that can cause unnecessary barriers to positive friendships.
